CPR - (Session 1-3 – Ed Center room 4)- 3 hour course to complete your CPR certification. Has additional processing fee of \$15.

Cub Scout Camping-The Basics (Session 2 – Upstairs room 1)-Put fun in the campout while considering Cub Scout age activities.

Cub Scout Camping-Advanced Insights (Session 4 – Upstairs room 1)-Requirements for Cub Scout camping, planning ahead, and how to camp.

Cub Scout Ceremonies (Sessions 1 & 3 – Ed Center 3)- Make your meetings more engaging and fun for both boys and parents.

Cub Scout Crafts (Session 1 & 3 – Library)-Learn and make fun projects that inspire your boys' creativity.

Cub Scout Games (Session 5 & 7 – Ed Center 3)-One of the foundations of the Scouting program is games. Learn how to plan and teach fun games for your Cubs.

Cub Scout Leader Specific (Session 1-2 – Downstairs 1) – Same content as the new online courses, with real live people who have experience with the Cub Scout programs.

Cub Scout Model Tiger Den Meeting (Session 4 – Downstairs 2) - Plan and experience a great meeting.

Cub Scout Model Wolf and Bear Den Meeting (Session 5 – Downstairs 2) - Plan and experience a great meeting.

Cub Scout Model Webelos Den Meeting (Session 3 – Downstairs 3) - Plan and experience a great meeting.

Cub Scout Model Pack Meeting (Session 3 – Downstairs 1) - Get ideas to make your Pack meetings memorable.

Cub Scout Science (Session 5 & 7 – Library) - Easy but challenging experiments to do with your Cubs.

Emergency Preparedness (Session 4 & 6 – Ed Center 5) - Homeland Security and BSA's emergency response.

Merit Badge Counselor (Session 1 & 5 – Upstairs 2) - Required training for all Merit Badge Counselors.

Patrol Method (Session 2 & 5 – Upstairs 3) - Empowering youth to be leaders is the core of Scouting. Scouts learn by doing. They develop program, take responsibility, and figure out how they will achieve their goals.

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Recruiting and Retention (Session 3 & 7 – Upstairs 2) - Brainstorm ideas for attracting and keeping youth and leaders engaged.

Scoutmaster Conferences (Sessions 4 & 7 – Upstairs 2) - Basic elements and timing of the ideal conference. Use situational skills - listening, coaching, mentoring.

SM/ASM (Session 8:00 – 4:00 – Ed Center 1) - full day course to complete your Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster, position specific training requirement. Handbook sold separately.

Special Needs Scouts (Session 5 & 7 – Ed Center 4) - How to adapt your program to meet the needs of your Scouts with special needs. This class is interactive with troubleshooting and discussion.

Venturing Advisor- (Session 2-5 – Ed Center 6) - 5 hour course to complete your Venturing Advisor, Associate Advisor or committee, position specific training requirement. (Includes Venturing Youth Protection).

Webelos to Scout Transition (Session 6 – Upstairs room 1) - Prepare leaders, youth and parents to continue the adventure!

Wilderness First Aid (Session 2-7 – Ed Center 2) - 6 hour recertification for the Boy Scout and Venturing High Adventure trek requirement. You must have attended the full 16 hour, Wilderness First Aid certification course in 2009 or earlier to attend this session. Has additional Red Cross processing fee of \$15.

Youth Protection Training (Session 2 – Ed Center 5) - Required for all leaders, with guidelines for protecting you too! Remember, Your Youth Protection certification must be renewed every two years.

Youth Protection Training for the Venturing Program (Session 3 – Ed Center 5) Required for all leaders in the Venturing program, with guidelines for protecting you too! Remember, Your Youth Protection certification must be renewed every two years.
